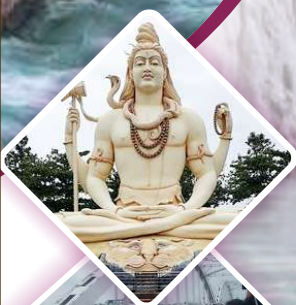

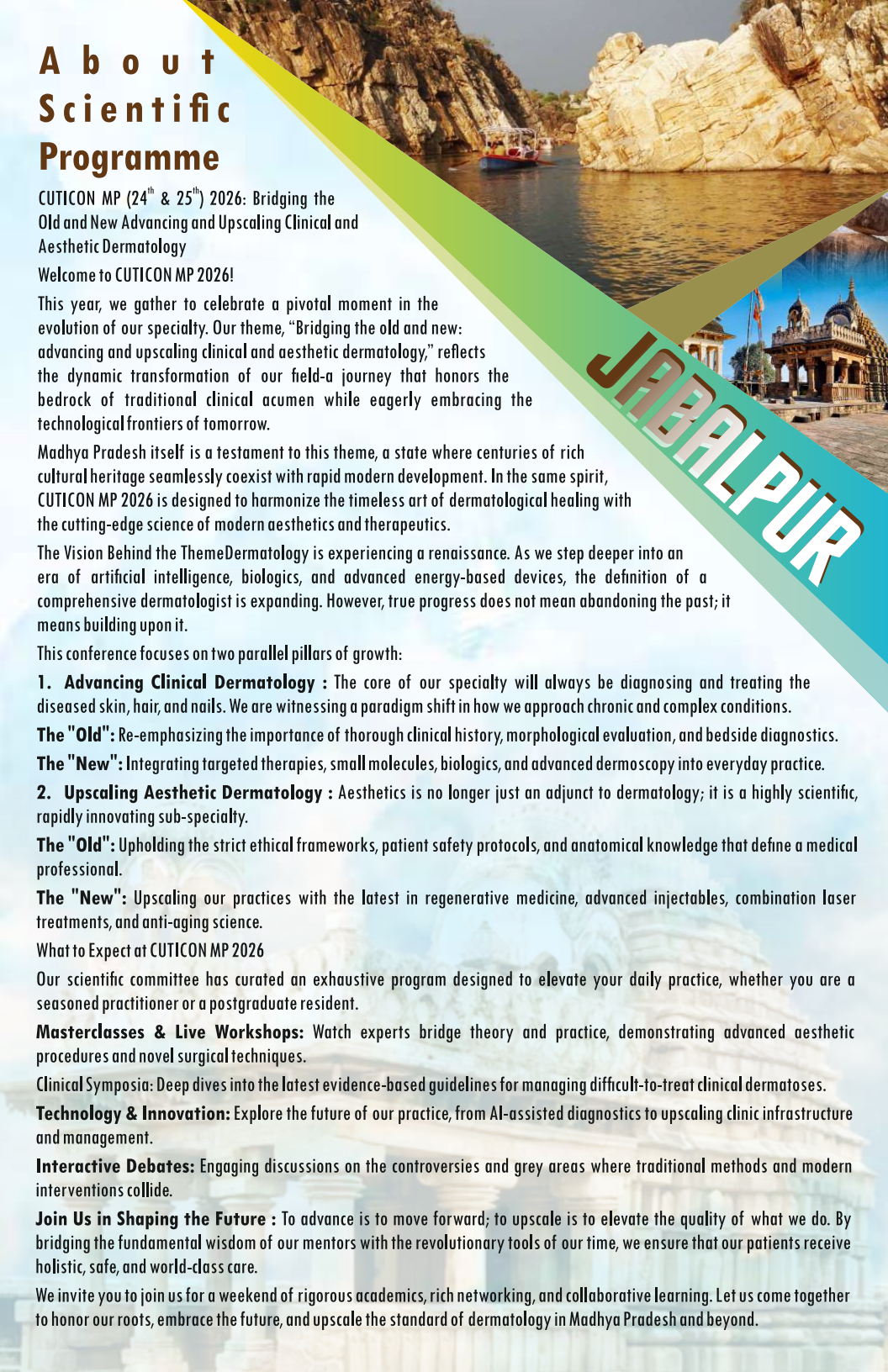

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ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

- Accepted abstracts will be presented either in Award Paper / Free Paper sessions or as Posters, subject to the decision of the Scientific Committee. Authors should specify their preferred category at the time of submission.
- The Scientific Committee reserves the right to reject any abstract without assigning a reason.
- Abstracts should represent original work being presented for the first time in a scientific forum. The work should not have been presented or published previously.
- Names of authors and their affiliations should be submitted on a separate page, along with the HOD affiliation letter and declaration of conflict of interest. The identity of the institute or authors should not appear anywhere in the main abstract text.
- A written undertaking, signed by the presenting author and authenticated by the Departmental Head, should confirm that the case/study has not been presented or submitted elsewhere. For studies, the presenting student should be the principal investigator or a co-investigator.
- Where applicable, a copy of the Institutional Ethics Committee clearance letter or receipt of application for ethical clearance, attested by the Departmental Head, should be submitted. The presenting author's name should appear in the IEC letter/application receipt as Principal Investigator/Co-Investigator.
- Supporting documents should be submitted in PDF/JPEG format. Handwritten undertakings /documents will not be accepted.

ABSTRACT DETAILS

- Maximum word limit: 250 words, in structured format.
- Studies: Title; Aims and Objectives; Materials and Methods; Results and Analysis; Discussion; Conclusion.
- Case Reports: Title; Introduction; Case Report; Discussion; Conclusion.
- All submitted abstracts will undergo blinded review and will be scored by judges.
- The top abstracts may be selected for the Award Paper session according to the recommendations of the judges. Remaining accepted abstracts may be considered for Free Paper or Poster presentation.
- PGTs may submit their work in the prescribed format for exclusive Poster presentation



PRESENTATION DETAILS

AWARD PAPER / FREE PAPER

- Sequence of speakers will be determined by the Scientific Committee.
- The number of slides should not exceed 15.
- The title slide should mention the title, presenting author, conflict of interest, and a self-declaration that the work has neither been presented nor published elsewhere.
- Questions for clarification will be allowed from the judges after the presentation.

POSTER SESSION

- The poster should include Introduction, Objective, Methods, Results, Discussion and Conclusion.
- Affiliation of co-authors may be mentioned.
- Conflict of interest and source of support are mandatory

3.	Undertaking for abstract submission and declaration of conflict of interest.

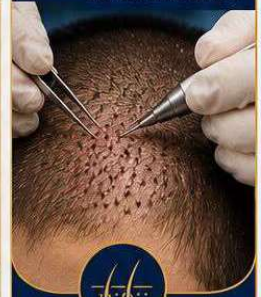

CADAVERIC DISSECTION

Anatomy • Exposure • Excellence

SESSION OVERVIEW

A focused cadaveric dissection experience designed to strengthen practical anatomical understanding and translate it into greater precision during dermatologic and aesthetic procedures. The emphasis is on direct anatomical exposure, guided dissection and correlation of structures with their clinical relevance. Participants will be encouraged to observe, identify and understand the anatomy that underpins accurate procedural planning and surgical precision.
